Joining instructions

Dear all,

Here are your 'joining instructions' for the ESRC seminar at the University of Bath on 12th March.

If arriving by car:

The main campus of the University of Bath is at Claverton Down, to the east of the city centre. If coming from the city centre perhaps the easiest route to take is up Bathwick Hill. But you can also reach the campus via North Road; or via Widdcombe Hill, then Claverton Down Road.

If arriving by train:

The train station is Bath Spa. The easiest way to get to the University of Bath campus is by taxi, from the main exit of the train station (10 minutes max; about £5). Remember that you are going to the University of Bath; not the other one: Bath Spa University. (There is also a bus, Orange No. 18, that goes to the Univ of Bath campus. But the shopping centre and bus station are currently under reconstruction, so finding the bus stop is complicated.)

Car parking on campus:

The East Car Park has a 'pay and display' system for visitors.

Seminar room:

The seminar will take place in Building 6 West (6W), Room 1.2. This is near the West Car Park.

Dinner on Wednesday 11th March:

If you will be in Bath on the evening prior to the seminar, you are very welcome to join us for 'Bath Night'. Please let us know if you will, so that we can advise the restaurant of the number of people to expect.

We have booked a table at the Mai Thai restaurant in Bath city centre from 19:30 onwards. The Mai Thai restaurant is located at No 6, Pierrepont Street, on the corner with South Parade, next to the Manvers Street Car Park, and below the George Hotel: <http://www.maithai.co.uk/>.

If you are coming by car, the best place to park is the Manvers Street Car Park.

If you are coming by train, the Mai Thai restaurant is just one block from Bath Spa station; i.e. less than 5 minutes' walk. Leave Bath Spa station by the main (front) exit. On the corner immediately in front of you, you will see the Royal Hotel. Cross over the road to the Royal Hotel and walk up Manvers Street. You will pass, on your right, in sequence: Baynton Bookbinders, the George Gregory Gallery, the Praxis Company offices, the Manvers Street Baptist Church, the police station, and Manvers Street Car Park. The Mai Thai restaurant is on the first corner that you come to.

Note that when you reach that corner Manvers Street becomes Pierrepont Street.
